

CROOKED CREEK HORSE PARK *at Manor Recreation Area*

TRAIL REGULATIONS

1. Crooked Creek Horse Park is 97.5 acres. It is a separate park from Crooked Creek Park. There are no boundary markers to show where Crooked Creek Horse Park ends and where the Crooked Creek Park begins. Park rangers are adamant about *no horses being anywhere within their park except on designated trails*. If you are found riding in Crooked Creek Park and you are not on the horse trail **YOU WILL BE FINED**.
2. You may ride anywhere within the horse park, except in the picnic area next to the administration building.
3. The marked trail within the horse park is about 3 miles long and marked with orange paint mostly on trees.
4. Outside of the horse park the trail system lies mainly inside the boundaries of Crooked Creek Park
5. The trail is marked with spray painted white dots on trees, white arrows on roads and trees, some surveyors tape in pink, and brown & white horse & rider emblems
6. There are about 35 miles of trail. You can ride 2 loops that start and end at the horse park. The shortest loop would be the Covered Bridge-Peninsula Lollipop Trail, about 13 miles long. An 18 mile loop starts and ends at the park by way of the Covered Bridge Trail and the Boat Launch Trail. Please refer to our trail map for directions. Longer loops are made by adding trail at Cochran's Mills., or *As noted on the map*, there are designated "P" parking areas in the Cochran's Mills and the Cherry Run Area at the far end of the CCHP trail. Here you can ride several small loops as shown on the trail map. The trail is easier and more scenic than the trail close to the horse park. These smaller loops *include Cherry Run Loop 3.5 miles, Rearicks Crossing Loop 9.4 miles, Manor Mineral Loop 12.1 miles. Or you can combine these loops into one for a 15 mile loop.*
7. **Maps are available for sale in the Administration Building** and a large map is posted inside the Information Center.
8. Since much of the adjacent land to the horse park is **privately owned and closed to riders**, we ask that you **DO NOT leave on horseback unless you are on the designated trails**. We suggest that someone familiar with the trail accompany you.

AS A USER OF THE HORSE TRAILS - You Must:

1. Use the trail at your own risk.
2. Stay on designated trails (orange paint in the horse park and white paint outside the horse park)
3. Ride safely and consider the safety of others.
4. Give vehicles and pedestrians the right of way.
5. Provide proper supervision and be responsible for your children's conduct.
6. Be aware that smoking on the trail is not approved by FAHA.
7. FAHA recommends the use of hard hats on all trails.

THE FOLLOWING ARE STRICTLY PROHIBITED ON THE TRAIL **Fires - Littering - Motorized Vehicles - Drugs - Alcohol** **Removal of Trees, Shrubs, or Flowers**
